Motor skills are actions that involve the movement of muscles in the body. They are divided into two groups: gross motor skills , which include the larger movements of arms, legs, feet, or the entire body (crawling , running, and jumping); and fine motor skills, which are smaller actions, such as grasping an object between the thumb and a finger or using the lips and tongue to taste objects.

Motor learning refers broadly to changes in an organism's movements that reflect changes in the structure and function of the nervous system. Motor learning occurs over varying timescales and degrees of complexity: humans learn to walk or talk over the course of years, but continue to adjust to changes in height, weight, strength etc. over their lifetimes.

However, two major epochs characterized research in the area of motor learning, one prior to the 1970s, where they aimed to verify which factors affected the acquisition of motor skills, such as practice in whole or in part, to mass or distributed practice, type of feedback, instruction among others, these researches used complex tasks such as sports skills.

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To this end, Fitts (1964; Fitts & Posner, 1967) suggests that motor skill acquisition follows three stages: the cognitive stage, the associative stage, and the autonomous stage. As a coach I found this simple paradigm to be extremely helpful for understanding, guiding, and accelerating the motor learning process.

This skill is termed orthographic-motor integration and it has been shown to contribute more to handwriting than to motor skills (Berninger & Amtmann, 2003).
